Judge tosses Biden administration's Title IX rewrite that conferred protections based on gender identity

A federal judge struck down a sweeping Title IX expansion for gender-confused individuals and other sexual behavior, the Associated Press reported. U.S. District Judge Danny C. Reeves' decision Thursday negated the entire 1,500-page guideline he called "fatally" flawed.

President Joe Biden's administration was behind the push to confer Title IX protections on so-called LGBTQ+ students last year. The law was initially passed in 1972, and it was done to prevent sex discrimination in education.

The Democratic administration made it their business to expand the definitions of those covered, including protections for sexual orientation and gender identity instead of biological sex.

Because of this, the update faced many challenges from those concerned about its impact on the safety of girls and women. This lawsuit resolved this week was filed by the attorneys general of Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Reeves concluded in his decision that the Department of Education had no authority to make the changes through the 50-year-old law. The judge called it an "attempt to bypass the legislative process and completely transform Title IX."

One specific issue was that it violated free speech by compelling educators to use preferred pronouns. "The First Amendment does not permit the government to chill speech or compel affirmance of a belief with which the speaker disagrees in this manner," Reeves wrote in his decision.

Dozens of Congress members outperformed the stock market in 2024. Here's who gained the most - and why

The stock market had a record-breaking run last year, but members of Congress still managed to outperform it with their portfolios making staggering gains in industries where they wield legislative power and influence, such as tech and energy.

More than 20 members made almost double the S&P500 average gain of 24.9 percent last year. The top five performers – Rep. David Rouzer (R-NC), Rep. Debbie Wasserman Schultz (D-FL), Ron Wyden (D-OR), Roger Williams (R-TX), Morgan McGarvey (D-KY) – increased the value of their portfolio value by more than 100 percent, according to a new report.

Former House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, who has become a lightning

rod for anger over lawmakers trading in stocks in recent years and has, according to the report, “an almost cult-like following for her financial disclosures,” saw the value of her household’s portfolio rise by 71 percent.

The report comes as several bipartisan measures aimed at banning the trading of stocks of individual companies by members of Congress appear to have stalled, despite overwhelming public support. A total of 11 bills have been proposed by lawmakers since 2022, but none have made it to a vote.

One of those efforts was spearheaded by Democratic representative Alexandria o Cortez, who worked on a bill with former Republican



representative Matt Gaetz. When asked to comment on the news that many members of Congress had outperformed the market again, Ocasio-Cortez said: “I don't think

California tribes celebrate historic dam removal: 'More successful than we ever imagined'

Explosions roared through the canyons lining the Klamath River earlier this year, signaling a new chapter for the region that hugs the Oregon-California border.

In October, the removal of four hydroelectric dams built on the river was completed - the largest project of its kind in US history.

The blast of the final dam was just the beginning. The work to restore the river, which winds 263 miles (423km) from the volcanic Cascade mountain range in Oregon to the Pacific coast in

northern California, is now under way.

Already it's been among the most hopeful environmental stories of past years. "It has been more successful than we ever imagined," said Ren Brownell, the spokesperson for the Klamath River Renewal Corporation, a non-profit created to oversee and implement the removal, adding: *"There's an incredible amount of joy."*

A drastic alteration

The Klamath River was once an ecological powerhouse - the third-largest salmon-producing

river in the American west. Its basin covered more than 9.4m acres (3.8m hectares) and its network of wetlands was the largest in the region. The ecosystem was home to millions of migrating birds. Tribes, including the **Hoopa, Karuk, Klamath, Modoc and Yurok**, thrived in this bountiful and beautiful watershed for thousands of years, with the river providing both sustenance and ritual.

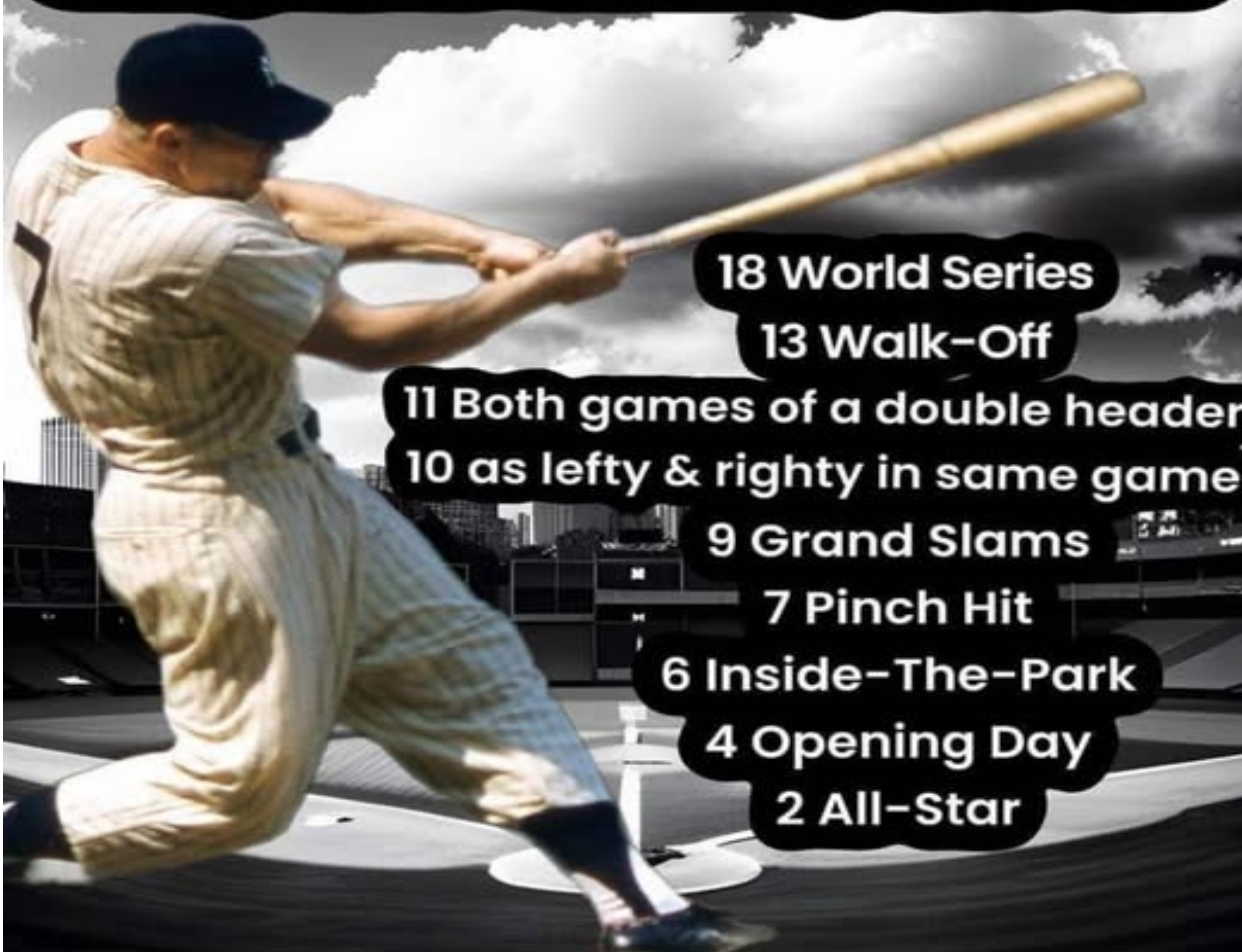

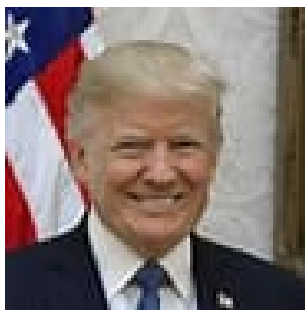
So imagine her shock when the same symbol featured on Hegseth's chest was found on both the floor and the funeral program cover at Carter's service.

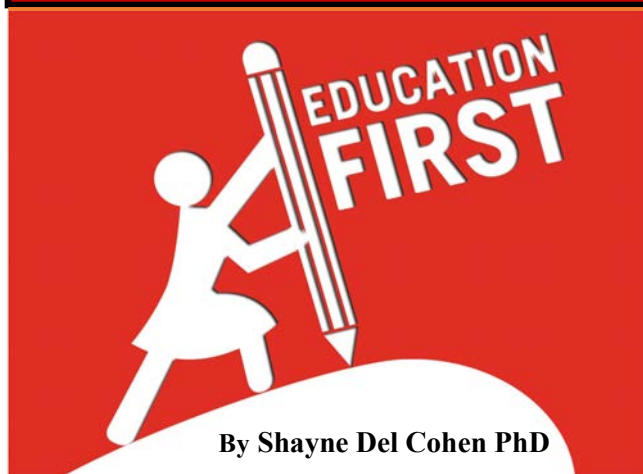

The "Five W's" of Journalism



For centuries most "civilizations" had slaves. We don't need to recount the history or refer to the myriad of ancient texts that chronicle man's "ownership" of others.

Slavery reached the epitome of world dominance during the "Age of Agriculture", especially in US history. The economy of the south is well known to have been built and dependent upon slave labor, but in actuality, slavery was also practiced above the Mason-Dixon line and had been a part of tribal practices throughout the continent.

Founding fathers debated this practice and the 1789 Constitution bore a section forbidding slave trading by 1808. Although there is documentation of some ships still arriving after this date, slave owners merely shifted to domestic slave breeding rather than importation after the legislated date. The mixing of DNA became a lucrative pastime.

Entering into "The Industrial Age", some refer to factory and other labor intense production as "slave labor". Working conditions and recompense became comparable to the legacies of field workers. The labor movement (and its bloody his-

tory) was a result out of which many now enjoy a 40-hr work week, decent pay and a variety of benefits.

However, we are now in "The Age of Information". "The Agricultural Age may have obliterated an ancient profile of slavery; the Industrial Age mechanized many traditional functions, causing labor to require new skills and organization. What are the challenges of this new age?"

A 2022 survey by Junior Achievement USA showed that 60% of U.S. high school students were more interested in starting their own business instead of working traditional jobs. The same article featured one of many students who have started their own business while still in school.

This is of course is facilitated by all the new tools available: internet for marketing, apps for picture taking, accounting, etc. Education, health care, limited product generation, all kinds of services and entertainment can be made, marketed and profitable in many new ways.

While news may decry many stores closing, it is often a function of a long-time business owner being "tired" and kids not wanting the

business or a simple business decision not to pay rental of space and upkeep, lease agreements requiring a percentage of profit, or the ability to operate efficiently with less staff. The latter does require Age of Information knowledge of a whole set of new tools and processes. It also provides a new landscape of possibilities for any idea.

What may have been "science fiction" in the past is now reality. One is literally plugged into the world - and all its little worlds - at a moment's notice.

Though exhilarating, it can also be overwhelming. And at this point, only a twenty four years into it, one can still opt out of it, choosing to live one's life in the reality into which they were born.

Traditionally, tribal leaders used the maxim "for seven generations" hence in making decisions. Many of those decisions came from a tradition and natural world that does not necessarily exist now. The rapid adoption of cell phones and everything associated bears testimony to this.

The challenge, therefore for tribal councils, is therefore producing pol-

icy and operations that reflect the vision of "youngsters" whose reality may be completely different from those that were born into times of no electricity, no internal potable water sources, no wireless connections and no economic control over destiny.

We cannot even imagine the world of seven generations hence, all though one can see the signs of population living in thirty-story buildings, eating cell-grown products, losing ties to the land, etc.

What does your community envision?

Take the time to invite everyone five years and older to provide their vision of the future. It will be different for each age-group but should provide a wide swath of subjects to include in your planning and setting vision. Take the wisdom of seven generations past and be the connector to the seven generations coming.

And record the journey. We have the tools through which you can communicate to future centuries. You may not be able to physically time-travel, but your thoughts, debates and actions can.

The "Five W's" of Journalism

who, what, where, why, and how - can be, and should be, a way to develop, nurture and instill critical thinking skills in those around you For those that have an organized classroom or regularly meeting teen group here is a suggested format. Have your students empty their purses or pockets on their desk table. Pick out an item. Put it through the questions: 1. Who (what) is this? 2. What does it do? 3. Where did it come from? How did it get here? 4. Why is it important? 5. How is it made? Once the student has chosen their item, they are to recount their existing knowledge about the item and then do formal research paper (two pages) on the item which answers all the 5 w's in greater depth. This all goes into a formally documented report which is then delivered to the group. Imagine the amount of knowledge one can gain in one afternoon! Developing the prowess to constantly think the 5 w's will give learners the ability to assess almost anything they view. Skipping up one notch Taking it to the next level, ask the students

to write down the first five things they do upon awaking ("or being woken up"). For example, open eyes, yell at whomever woke me, stretch, put on slippers/socks, pee, splash water, pray, etc. etc. The critical factor is to relate the 5 w's to the action item. While there may be some similarities, each student must pick one to write up....try for as little duplication as possible. Participants will then read their findings to their peer group, causing both shock and mirth concurrently. This process may be repeated for different times of the day It should involve a lot of self science, in other words nerve/brain synapses, specific organic functions,, etc. hopeful underscoring what a miraculous machine each body is. Self awareness/knowledge is fundamental to providing a strong base for comparison. It should teach respect for other beings and their differences although some choose to adopt superiority or inferiority complexes. In any event, a student's knowledge and recognition of how/why each person is differen should assist that student to look at things with a critical ability to list those differences understand their derivation, begin to

understand how they function and affect the student an or his/her world, and begin to communicate/learn about that person, thing, process, institution, etc. This also applies to "things", institutions, environment - everything that surrounds the learner. Questions that may help direct the inquiries: 1. Encounter (where) with another mammal (who/what) . How/why are we different How/why are we the same? What is the impact of this object in my life? 2. Encounter with a plant. See above 3. You are in your house/apt/trailer/tent. What is it? How did it get here? Why are we in the same place and time? How is "thing" used....in my life or others? 4. You are in this classroom/meeting room. See above for same questions. It has been said that part of "the terrible two's" that drives parents/grandparents/extended family crazy, is the constant "Why". The little person is trying to put together how things it, how they work, etc. It is not usually possible to get it the first time around The little needs t look at it differently with each "why" It would seem that two-year olds have better critical thinking skills than us old folk

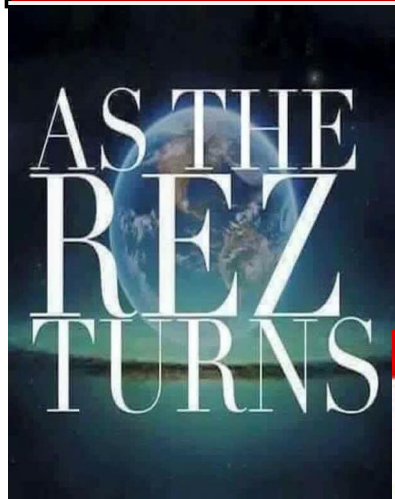

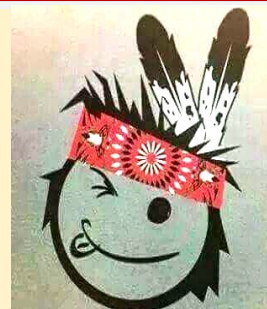

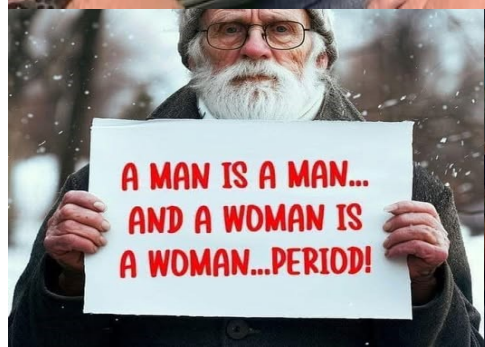
